

Understanding Evangelism

- Godliness requires that we <u>discipline</u> ourselves in the <u>practice</u> of evangelism.
- Among the reasons we don't speak of Christ more often is **fear**.

EVANGELISM IS EXPECTED

All Christians are not expected to use the same <u>method</u> of evangelism, but all Christians are <u>expected</u> to evangelize.

What is evangelism? Communicating the gospel.

Anyone who faithfully relates the **essential** elements of God's **salvation** through Jesus Christ is evangelizing.

Why is evangelism expected of us? Jesus commanded us to witness.

Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47; John 20:21; Acts 1:8

While it's true that God gifts some for ministry as **evangelists**, He calls all believers to be His witnesss and provides them with both the **power** to witness and a powerful **message**.

EVANGELISM IS EMPOWERED

Sometimes we fail to speak of Christ out of **fear** of **rejection**.

In some cases, the **method** of witnessing we're asked to use causes our **evangelophobia**.

Often, it's the <u>seriousness</u> of evangelism that frightens us from engaging. The <u>eternal destiny</u> of the person is the issue.

Many Christians feel too <u>unprepared</u> or simply have too little <u>faith</u>, thus are terrified of entering into such an eternally important situation.

We need to understand that sharing the gospel in itself is <u>successful</u> evangelism.

In this regard, we're like the postal service: success is measured by the <u>careful</u> and <u>accurate</u> delivery of the message, not by the <u>response</u> of the recipient.

THE HOUSE OF HOPE MACON

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We are not all empowered to evangelize the same way, but by the **Holy Spirit**, all believers have been given **power** to be witnesses of Jesus Christ.

It is the **gospel** that is the power of God for salvation and not our own eloquent power or **persuasiveness**.

There is also a power for evangelism in living a sincere Christian life. 2 Corinthians 2:14-17

The most powerful ongoing Christian witness has always been the **speaking** of God's word by one who is **living** God's word.

EVANGELISM IS A DISCIPLINE

Evangelism is a natural <u>overflow</u> of the Christian life. We should all be able to talk about what the Lord has <u>done</u> for us and what He <u>means</u> to us.

**Matthew 5:16*

Unless we discipline ourselves for evangelism, it is very easy to <u>excuse</u> ourselves from ever <u>sharing</u> the gospel with anyone.

Colossians 4:5-6

The goal with unbelievers is to <u>dialogue</u> with them in a way that their <u>hearts</u> and <u>minds</u> might be opened to the gospel.

The best way to turn conversations toward <u>spiritual</u> matters is to ask the person how you can <u>pray</u> for him/her.

While some find evangelizing easier through <u>speaking</u>, others may find that they evangelize more through

serving.

Whether through serving or speaking, witnessing must be by <u>design</u>, not by <u>default</u>.

The more we are <u>like</u> Christ, the more we will tell <u>of</u> Christ and His <u>message</u>.
